Collection of Information

Morris Nichols collects personal information that you knowingly and willingly provide when you complete forms available on www.mnat.com and/or personal but anonymous information that is generated by your web browser.

Personal but Anonymous Information

Your web browser will automatically send us your IP address, name of your Internet Service Provider, name and version of your operating system and web browser, date, time, and pages that you visit. Your IP address only identifies the number automatically assigned to your computer when you connect to the Internet and does not identify you by name.

We use other web-based technologies, including cookies, for a variety of purposes, such as to ascertain how visitors use our site (pages visited, links used, length of stay on each page), to support certain site features and functionalities (so you can avoid re-entering information you established on prior site visits), and to personalize your site experience.

You can set your browser to reject cookies or to alert you when a cookie is placed on your computer, or you can delete our cookies upon leaving our site. Although you are not required to accept cookies when you visit MNAT.COM, without them, certain site features and functionality will be disabled.
